### NOVA SCOTIA OFF ROAD RIDERS QUESTIONNAIRE

- 1. If elected, will you continue support of the OHV MAC as it stands today? –**  
Yes. The Liberal Party will continue to support of the OHV MAC. We believe it is an important component of OHV riding in Nova Scotia and provides important advice, policies, comments and suggestions to government.
